ABSTRACT

Desertion has become an important topic in maintaining a law and order of the society. Majority of the deserters are committed social malpractices falling national security in danger. During the last pace of humanitarian operations and the peacetime significant increase of crimes can be identified. This laid the foundation for researcher to conduct a study on to find out the reasons to influence deserters to commit social malpractices.
