Abstract

The revival of the Maritime silk Route by China has already made many Security Concerns over the regional powers of the IOR as well as the extra regional powers like USA. The Hambanthota harbor which was built solely from the funding by china is considered as a part of "String of Pearls" which encircle the India strategically from the south also a major security concern of India.
